## Dicoma capensis

**Description:** A creeper. The flowers have white / brown petals with pale purple stamens. Leaves are long, slim and crinkly; grey-green in colour. The leaves and stem are covered in soft, white "wool". The seeds are very fluffy and feathery. This specimen was collected in July, the flowers were mostly dried out, seeds had formed and some had already dispersed. Growth of the plant followed particularly good summer rainfall.

Habitat: Dry riverbeds

Varous spp. of Dicoma have medicinal properties. D. Capersis is taken for fever, colds and 'flu', also for hypertension, diarrhoea and concer. Fresh + dry root, root decochions and tinctures are used.

**Plant features:** Spreading creeper. Inflorescence made up of many ray florets with white/brown petals and purple stamens. Leaves and stem grey/green and covered in soft, white wool. Hundreds of fluffy seeds.
