


# *Rogeria longiflora*

**Family:**

**Pedaliaceae**



**Collection Number: 32**

**Description:** A tall, single stemmed plant. The stem is squarish and woody, slightly sticky to the touch. Leaves are large and branch out from the stem in pairs opposite each other. The pods are clustered around the stem and point upwards. Flowers are trumpet-shaped, large and creamy. The plant has a strong smell.

**Habitat:** Dry riverbeds, where it is common and very conspicuous, even when it is dried out.

PLANT FEATURES<sup>17-24</sup>  
Single stem, large leaves branching from stem, fruit-pods all pointing upwards, clustered around stem.  
+ - 3 to 4 from stem. Creamy flowers, trumpet shape.  
stem square shaped. - felt slightly sticky. Strong smell.

NOTES<sup>25-31</sup> Local abundance<sup>25</sup> Common  
Lots of small black ants.  
Flowers at the top of the plant, fruits developed further down the stem. Still green.
